





Report of the Free Dental Camp Organized by Oxigen & Sahyog Foundation At NGO Spread a smile, Delhi On Feb 21st 2019



Poor oral hygiene is observed in over 70% of urban children, with socioeconomic inequalities being a key determinant. The cost of seeing a dentist and dental procedures is very high, so most people with low income avoid going to qualified practitioners.

Poor oral hygiene has an impact on the overall health of children and affects their growth and health. To help

children overcome these issues Oxigen & Sahyog Foundation with the support of Dr Devesh Oberoi conducted a dental camp on 21st Feb 2019 at Spread a smile India NGO Munirka center which offers free education including books and uniform to the children residing on streets, under flyovers and in slums, below poverty line students and those who belong to weaker

section of society. The camps include dental checkups for children and adolescent girls, prescriptions and references to Oberoi Dental clinic, Defense Colony for procedures as well as follow ups.

As many as 168 students were examined during the dental camp. Educational awareness on good oral hygiene practices was also given through a talk on how to maintain





oral Hygiene .During the Screening majority of the Children in the age group of 6-17 years were found to be chewing tobacco on regular basis.
