The sole aim of the camp was to have eye care services at the doorstep of the villagers & Slum dwellers who otherwise couldn't afford the same.


The sequence of steps taken to screen, transport, and conduct the surgery are as follows:

1) The patients who come to the camp site are registered

Believing that No gift could be better than the gift of sight, Oxigen and Sahyog Foundation in association with Lions Eye Hospital organized free Cataract surgery camp at Lions Hospital on 18th **April 2019**. The surgery camp was organized after three eye check-up, treatment and cataract surgery screening camps at Sonepat & Rajasthan villages and Noida slum in March and April 2019. Nearly 600 eye patients visited the camp sites. Of these, 35 patients were identified for cataract surgeries and 16 of them interested for surgery came to Hospital for the procedure on 18 th April 2019. 14 Successful free cataract surgeries were done after Free diagnosis and treatment facilities were made available to poor patients. The camp was followed by distribution of Free Medicines & Black Eye glasses for the patients to protect their eyes from direct sunlight, dust particles and other



- 2) The patients are screened to determine their eyesight problem
- 3) Those found in need of cataract surgery are tested for interocular pressure
- 4) Patients are then screened for high blood pressure and blood sugar
- 5) The patients who do not have any health complications and are deemed to be in need of cataract surgery are subjected to a final screening by the ophthalmologist
- 6) Patients are then transported to the hospital by bus provided by the OXIGEN & SAHYOG Foundation
- 7) The patients are admitted to the hospital and are operated the same day. During the surgical procedure, clouded lens is removed and a plastic intra-ocular lens is implanted
- 8) after staying for few hours, the patients are checked to ensure that there are no complications and are then transported back home.



Oxigen & Sahyog foundation has brought a new ray of hope for the hopeless and helpless people. The patients being operated at hospital acknowledge that with the help & blessings of volunteers rendering selfless services to them more than their own kin they will be able to restore their vision back. The happiness on the faces of patients getting operated in the eye camp can be clearly seen.
