Urban slum ,where they were examined by experienced ophthalmologists and advised the treatment and even many of them underwent cataract surgeries free of charges. "We are satisfied by the services that have been made available in the camp" Vijay Singh , an attendant whose elderly father underwent cataract surgery in the camp said.

Oxigen & Sahyog foundation has successfully completed two more Cataract surgery camp, aimed at giving Marginalized population back their sight. On December 5th & 26th, 2019 Oxigen CSR working together with Lions Eye hospital and Janak puri Dharmik and Samajik Mahasangh, At First camp on 5th December screened 750 people in its last 2 camps, 22 patients with cataract were identified out of which 11patients willing were operated and giving people back their vision. lenses till now". Dr. Mathur further added that many people even from outside the state such as Rajasthan & U,P have availed the facility and were satisfied enough after the surgery and allied treatment. He said that the camps will continue and they want more and more patients to come and avail the opportunity.


.The sequence of steps taken to screen, transport, and conduct the surgery are as follows:

- 1) The patients who come to the camp site are registered
- 2) The patients are screened to determine their eyesight problem
- 3) Those found in need of cataract surgery are tested for inter-ocular pressure
- 4) Patients are then screened for high blood pressure and blood sugar
- 5) The patients who do not have any health complications and are deemed to be in need of cataract surgery are subjected to a final screening by the ophthalmologist
- 6) Patients are then transported to the hospital by bus provided by the OXIGEN & SAHYOG Foundation
- 7) The patients are admitted to the hospital and are operated the same day. During the surgical procedure, clouded lens is removed and a plastic intra-ocular lens is implanted



are then transported back home. Patients were grateful to Oxigen & Sahyog Foundation for conducting such surgeries free of cost. They are now able to feel the world once again through their improved visions. Meals and medicines were provided along with a full day's rest at hospital after the surgery. The patients are also provided with post-operative medication, colored glasses and two follow up visits. Proud to Share that Patients were very happy with surgery & the arrangements at hospital.
